Rheumatic fever (RF) is an inflammatory disease that can involve the heart, joints, skin, and brain. The disease typically develops two to four weeks after a streptococcal throat infection. Signs and symptoms include fever, multiple painful joints, involuntary muscle movements, and occasionally a characteristic non-itchy rash known as erythema marginatum.

DEFINITIONS. Arthritis denotes an inflammatory reaction in the joint space. The inflammatory reaction is designated by activation of the innate immune defense mechanisms by e.g., microbial invasion, autoimmune reaction, or synovial deposition of crystals, such as monosodium urate monohydrate or calcium pyrophosphate crystals.

Infective endocarditis is an infection of the inner surface of the heart, usually the valves. Symptoms may include fever, small areas of bleeding into the skin, heart murmur, feeling tired, and low red blood cell count. Complications may include valvular insufficiency, heart failure, stroke, and kidney failure.. The cause is typically a bacterial infection and less commonly a fungal infection.

Bacillus cereus. B. cereus in particular is a frequently recognised cause of toxin-induced acute gastroenteritis, however this genus may also cause sepsis, pneumonia, endocarditis, central nervous system (CNS) and ocular infections.. ABATACEPT (Orencia), a selective costimulation modulator, inhibits T cell (T lymphocyte) activation by binding to CD80 and CD86, thereby blocking interaction with CD28. This interaction provides a costimulatory signal necessary for full activation of T lymphocytes. Activated T lymphocytes are implicated in the pathogenesis of RA and are found in the synovium of patients with RA.

Differential diagnosis. If the sore throat is due to a viral infection the symptoms are usually milder and often related to the common cold.; If due to infection with Coxsackievirus, small blisters develop on the tonsils and the roof of the mouth. The blisters erupt in a few days and are followed

by a scab, which may be very painful.

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
